Round and Trade Lakes - Improvement Association

My name is Gary Johnson and I am a retired accountant. I have a Bachelor of Science Degree from the University of Detriot with a major in accounting and a finance minor My work background included financial reporting, budgeting, payroll, retirement plans and financial/expansion projections. My background does not include auditing, but does include extensive review of financial records/reports.

I have reviewed the financial statements of the "Round and Trade Lakes - Improvement Association" which comprises their financial postion as of July 28, 2021 and the related deposit and expense detail from September 25, 2018 to July 28, 2021. In my opinion, upon reviewing the provided financial statements and related detail referred to above, these statements fairly represent, the financial position of the "Round and Trade Lakes - Improvement Association" as of July 28, 2021.

The income accounts reviewed were initially the Bremer Bank checking and savings accounts. During the review period, Royal Credit Union replaced Bremer Bank and the final reviews included RCU – checking, savings and money market accounts.

The checking account deposits included association dues of \$40 (sometimes higher which I assume are either catchup dues or donations), grant revenue, interest income and raffle profits and other miscellaneous income. Credit card and PayPal fees occasionally show when cards are used for dues payments.

Beginning in September 2019 RCU's Money Market account was used for depositing grant revenue and also in September 2019 RCU's checking account was used for depositing income that had previously been deposited into Bremer Bank's checking account. In August 2020 Bremer Bank's accounts were closed and rolled into RCU's checking account.

Expenses include: LEAPS – which is a DNR authorized consulting group that helps the Association to request grants and subsequently are paid from grant money. CBCW (clean boat, clean water) are individuals who monitor boat landings and other access places and are paid with grant money. Other expenses include postage, printing, repairs and maintence, computer and internet, Wisconsin State Lab of Hygiene, Endangered Resources Services, Northern Aquatic Services, supplies and other misc exenses. Other ordinary expenses were a donation of \$500 to Round Lake Landing and \$2,225.05 was spent for t-shirts. The t-shirt expense was reimbursed by t-shirt sales.

In reviewing the income and expenses, I feel that they all are related to the health of the lakes that the association represents.

It should be noted that on September 28, 2018 their was no grant money waiting to be disbursed, however on July 28, 2021 there are \$20,381.08 in grant pre-payments, which are classified as current liabilities. The balance sheet looks strong on July 28, 2021 with \$53,053.50 in assets and equity of \$32,672.
